

Danny Lanteigne Memorial Scholarship

The Atlantic First Nations Water Authority (AFNWA) represents progress, innovation, and a long-term solution for water and wastewater problems that affect Atlantic First Nations communities. This pan-Atlantic Utility will provide a common standard for water and wastewater treatment quality along with improved management and increased resources to deal with long standing water challenges faced by Atlantic First Nations. As part of the Water Authority approach to sustainable service delivery, we are offering this award to promote careers in the water sector to indigenous students. We are looking to support the future leaders in water and wastewater management.

This scholarship is awarded in memory of Danny Lanteigne for his contributions to the water and wastewater industry and First Nations communities. Danny worked for the City of Fredericton for 25 years where he made an impact as the supervisor of water treatment, achieving a level 4 certification in water treatment and distribution. After his career with the City of Fredericton, he joined the Circuit Rider Training Program where he provided direct support to 23 First Nation communities in Atlantic Canada through mentoring and training of Operators. He will always be remembered for his passion and dedication to safe drinking water and wastewater, and his love for Family, Operators, and the outdoors.

The funds will be prior to first tuition payment in advance of the Fall Term. The donor will be notified of the recipient details in October of each academic year, after the add/drop date for the program. If a student changes their program before the add/drop date, the award will be reawarded to the next most eligible applicant). Please note, it is \$4000/year (\$2,000 in the first time and \$2000 in the second term) for a full-time student or \$2000 for a part-time student.

*awarded every two years, unless the renewable portion is not disbursed, then it can be re-awarded in the second year.
